Workshop Details

Presenter: Must be a CMCA member. If selected presenters must register for the Summit. Each presenter and one co-presenter, of the selected workshops, will be given a discounted registration rate of \$100 per person. Any additional presenters must pay the full Summit registration fee. All presenters are responsible for their travel expenses.

Time: Each workshop is **90 minutes.** This includes time for question/answer.

Workshop Tracks: All workshop proposals must designate a workshop track in order to be considered. The tracks include:

- Advocacy
- Chaplains
- Juvenile
- Church leaders
- Jail/Prison Ministry
- Reentry

Workshop Outcomes: Address one of the focus areas as you develop your proposal outcomes.

- **Growing in Christ:** includes strategies for bringing people to Christ and helping others grow in their spiritual walk
- **Achieving results:** includes evidence-based practices, addressing criminogenic factors, research, and program evaluation
- Changing the environment: includes advocacy, organizational and culture change, and restorative justice
- Growing as professionals: includes skill-building, certification, and core competencies

Workshop Selection Criteria

A committee selects the workshops using the following criteria:

- Topic is relevant and has clear description and outcomes
- Presenter's experience, education, and credentials
- Workshop is consistent with CMCA mission, vision, and core beliefs
