As senior director for Chaplaincy Ministries, Manny Cordero leads the efforts of Assemblies of God U.S. chaplains internationally.

Prior to his appointment as senior director, Manny served as the Correctional Ministries representative for Chaplaincy Ministries. He is ordained with the Pennsylvania/Delaware district, and has been in prison ministry for forty years.
