

Dr. Michael L. Reighard currently serves the Assemblies of God as the Critical Incident Ministries Chaplaincy Representative, including chaplains of police, firefighters, responders, and emergency services.

In addition to his present chaplaincy role, he has served over 20 years as Supervisory Chaplain for the Federal Bureau of Prisons.
