Oscar is courteous with a consistent smile. He's so pleasant, it's hard to believe this 27-year-old was ever incarcerated. But a co-worker tricked him and withdrew cash from their workplace. Oscar was held liable and given the option to pay the monies back. "I didn't know it wasn't his card," he says. "I couldn't pay the money, so I was taken to court."

While in prison, a pastor invited him to a *Project Philip* Bible study. "Going through the lessons helped me to understand what I was reading," he says. "And they equipped us to share it with fellow inmates." He says receiving a Prison Bible, and learning how to share the Gospel, gave his life new purpose.

Although he faces stigma from society, Oscar sees himself through Christ's eyes. And now, so does his family. He beams when he talks about them seeing the change in him. He got up at 4 am to pray, consistently. "At first my family thought I was pretending, but then realized I'd truly changed. I even talked to my little sister about the Word of God," he grins.


The Year in Review
