Expository Preaching -

- grounds the message in the text so that all the sermon's points are the points in the text, and it majors in the text's major ideas.
- It aligns the interpretation of the text with the doctrinal truths of the rest of the Bible (being sensitive to systematic theology).
- And it always situates the passage within the Bible's narrative,
- showing how Christ is the final fulfillment of the text's theme (being sensitive to biblical theology).


The Goal of every Sermon
