Definition of Scripture Engagement - p. 103

"Scripture engagement is a way of hearing and reading the Bible with an awareness that Christ encounters us in Scripture. It is an abiding in, meditating over, reflection upon, dwelling in, or a pondering of the Scriptures, resulting in a "transformative engagement" with God, an allowing of the Holy Spirit to form us through his Word."































